Launch of the Parish Giving Scheme

In October, we are launching the Parish Giving Scheme!

The Parish Giving Scheme is a 21st century solution to offset one of the greatest threats to parish income: static giving. Donations made through the Scheme use Direct Debits: they can be monthly, quarterly or annual. If the Scheme becomes a church's principal funding method, giving is inflation-proofed, cash-flow is maximised, and administration is minimised.

We are holding three launch events:

Parish Survey

A reminder that the 'middle years' focus team met recently and discussed what help may be available via the deanery to parishes and what information and ideas parishes may be able to share with others.

It was agreed that one of the first actions was to gauge what parishes needed help with in this area of mission and what they had to offer as expertise to other parishes. A questionnaire has been sent to PCC secretaries, incumbents and wardens asking for information (and discussion at PCC where possible) on the following questions:

- 1. How does your parish engage with people aged 20-50 in your church and community?
- 2. Are there areas where you think you need help/advice/training
- 3. Do you have experience of engagement working well/things that haven't worked to share with others?
- 4. Anything else you wish to add- any resources you could share.

Spirituality Summer School 2017

On July 17th -21st 25 people met together as a community at St Helen's church Darley Dale for Bishop Alastair's ninth Summer School; the theme for the week "Living in the Trinity ". This is a brief overview of the week. Each day of the week consisted of morning prayer, teaching, mid-day prayer, invited speakers and closing worship. Throughout each day there was opportunity to take time out for reflection and discussion with others, with refreshments and lunch provided daily. Bishop Alastair's teaching looked at a range of aspects of the Trinity and how it relates to our spirituality.

Day 1 The Trinity: from 2 to3 to1 +Alastair

Father and Son 2 became3 with the Spirit but these 3 are 1 Jesus uses the Agricultural Trinity in his teaching -Jesus the Seed- God the Ground- Spirit creates the Fruit

Unity and Diversity +Alastair

Simplistically - God is in everything. Trinity calls us to face up to judgement and challenges. The reality of the Cross is that we live between darkness and light. There is no escape of being in a perfect place living with God. We can't step out of the world if we are living in the Trinity.

In the afternoon, Bishop Jack talked about Icons and their use and gave us opportunity to spend time in meditation with an icon of our choosing and then to share reflections on the experience. Day 2 Participation +Alastair

We participate in the rhythm of life and creation. We looked in more depth at the act of the Eucharist within the trinity.

Creed - +Alastair

The Nicaean Creed explains the Trinity; the Apostle's Creed is a prayer It invites us to pray ourselves into the life of the Trinity. The living and the dead will be judged on how we participate in this process.

In the afternoon, the Revd Ian Mountford gave a presentation of Celtic Mission.

Day 3 Well Being in the 21st Century- Revd Val Hart

Val outlined some of the challenges at this present time which have an effect on our health Personal +Alastair

Trinity through the lens of the person. To live in the Trinity is practical; what is my/our contribution to society; what are my/our relationships/groups; what is my/our witness to others. Trinity and Tradition +Alastair

From the perspective of the Church Fathers looking at the Eucharist as a party and in + Alastair's trade mark style he gave a 12 point Party Plan (too much detail for this overview)

Day 4 Praying in the Trinity- + Alastair

Coptics believed we are made in the Trinity Father –Maker, Mother- Seed, Self-Fruit St Augustine =- lover-beloved –love. To pray in the Trinity we need to pray in love. <u>Trinity and Theology + Alastair</u>

Thinking about God (Theology) is unsettling. We looked at the 9 orders of angels and the tree groups of three. The more we accept the ordering the more we can find our place.

We learn from those above us and give grace and learning to those below. If we find our place in the order it is like Dancing with God in the life of the Trinity.

In the afternoon the Revd Alan Harper and the Revd Richard Meade talked on Christianity and Mindfulness and led a prayer walk around the church yard centred on mindfulness.

Day 5 <u>Trinity And Society and Trinity and Worship both by +Alastair</u> but as I was unable to attend that day I do not have notes. The week closed with the community joining for the Eucharist in the afternoon.

It is difficult to put into words the week's experience. It is good to take time out from the daily stresses and strains and to spend time in a peaceful setting learning, reflecting, praying and meditating.

Freedom Week 15 - 22 October

Freedom Sunday is the Church's national day of remembrance For modern slavery and has been marked on the second Sunday In October for a number of years. This significant crime cuts across all our communities and sectors of our economy. It is important therefore for us to reach out to new partners and encourage everyone to participate in their own context, which might be the 9-5 of working hours or the school day. Last year, the Bishop of Derby created the 'Freedom Week' initiative, with a chain of light and prayer across the Diocese, to commemorate modern slavery survivors, and those who work



to eradicate this evil trade in human beings. There was great support from parishes, ecumenical partners, civic leaders, and the local authorities, through awareness raising, prayer vigils and two candles passed across each archdeaconry.

+Alastair would like to encourage even more parishes to take part again during 15-22 October – passing the light around your community connections as well – also to encourage people to reflect on modern slavery through a paper chain of messages. Project Parachinar: The Edwardes College School Multi-Faith Education

Parachinar in Northern Pakistan is in a tribal area of high radicalisation with many refugees as it lies only twenty-five miles from the Afghan border. The people have suffered greatly because of terrorism and sectarian clashes and they need to experience healing and to discover a better way of living together harmoniously based on understanding and tolerance rather than fear and prejudice.





Project Parachinar - Ensuring a future free from radicalisation

After eight years of negotiation with the government, Bishop Humphrey has been given a disused building and permission to open the first Church School in the area on the understanding that Muslims and Christians, boys and girls will be educated together. This timely project will help prevent further radicalisation and extremism and give children in the area hope and the possibility of a different future.

Please pray for the week of mission in Breaston from 8 to 15 October. We have a team of 12 people from the Mathetes Trust and Through Faith Missions coming to the village to work with St Michael's and the Methodist Church. The forerunner to the mission has been regular prayer with the Methodist Church. We felt that the next step was to do evangelism together. We have had three training sessions over the summer and most of us feel out of our depth. On 9th September we did a 'belief questionnaire' in the village as a training exercise and were surprised at the amount of 'warm conversations', which we put down to the amount of prayer that's been going on.

There are four prongs to the mission. The first is the events planned as the attached programme. The second is the team going to existing groups that we run or have contact with. The third is a door to door 'belief' survey which builds upon a survey we did a number of years ago asking what people would like to see in Breaston. The fourth is home meetings where spiritual journeys will be discussed.

Pray for all of the organisation that needs to be in place for the mission to take place.

Pray that church members will get behind the mission and invite friends and family to events. Pray that the Holy Spirit would convict and draw people to Jesus.
