Details will be sent out to all synod members before the end of January.

2021 will be an important year for the development of our deanery and diocese, so do play your full part in the Synod structure.

We do hope that, later in the year, we can move to actual, in person, meetings but at the moment it is hard to plan ahead. We will let you have further synod dates as we have them but, unlike previous years, we cannot give a set of dates for the year as there are so many variables to contend with. There will be at least 2 other synod dates, one in the summer and one in the autumn term and we will confirm them as soon as possible.

In July there will also be elections for the next diocesan synod, membership of this will give an opportunity to convey the views of congregations and to be part of shaping the future vision.

We look forward to working with you in the coming year.

#### Annual Parochial Church Meetings and Electoral Roll 2021

Although we have not long since had belated elections of wardens and PCC members, the requirement at present is that 2021 elections will take place according to normal timeframes, so should be by 31<sup>st</sup> May 2021. This year, electoral rolls should be updated as necessary, but a new roll is not required. Details of what is required of PCCs and the duty of the electoral roll officer can be found at <u>http://www.derby.anglican.org/en/church-admin/church-information/electoral-roll.html</u>

APCMs will take place in parishes by 31<sup>st</sup> May. Hopefully by then, these may be during a physical meeting. However, where last years meeting agreed for postal or proxy voting, there is the option for people to vote without being present or for the meeting to be held remotely if necessary. More details of this will be available in the early spring

This year there is the opportunity to fill any vacant parish places on deanery synod. It is important that synod members are recorded and details passed to the deanery and diocese as this year there will be elections for places on both the diocesan and general synods and members of the deanery synod members, lay and clergy, form the electoral body. There are forms which should be used for both the electoral roll and for those wishing to stand as members of PCC, deanery synod or as church wardens on the Church of England Parish Resources website. Candidates need to fill in a declaration that they are a 'fit and proper person' in respect of financial requirements as trustees under the rules of the Charity Commission. This also applies to fees officers and gift aid secretaries if they are not PCC members. The declaration will also require a statement that the candidate is not barred under the DBS safeguarding rules. Upon appointment all PCC members should undertake a DBS check if they do not already have one. Please contact Angela for more information

A reminder that new fees are applicable from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2021 for weddings, funerals, monuments etc. A guide to Church of England Fees and how payments for service cover etc. should be calculated is available at <u>https://derby.anglican.org/en/church-</u> <u>admin/fees/fees-2021.html</u> In general, the increase from last year is only £1 or £2 per item on last year's fees

We are sorry to report that Bob Hulls, warden of Dale Abbey, passed away in December. Please pray for his wife Jenn and family and the congregations of Dale Abbey, Stanton by Dale and Risley at this sad time.

The new Bishop of Repton is Rt Revd Canon Malcolm Macnaughton,

previously Chief of Staff to the Archbishop of York. Malcolm is married to Pam, an ordained pioneer minister and a leadership specialist with the Church Pastoral Aid Society. Bishop Malcolm was due be consecrated Bishop at Lambeth Palace at the end of January. This has been delayed due to Covid but he will be licensed to work in the diocese in the meantime, from 28th January, as Suffragan Bishop-Designate. His installation as Bishop of Repton, and welcome to the

diocese, will be soon after his consecration, which it is now hoped will be in April. Bishop Malcolm will live at Swanwick

Archdeacon Christopher has now retired. Reverend Canon Peter Walley has been appointed acting Archdeacon of Derby until April when decisions on the structure of archdeaconries may be in place.

Diocesan Staff are mostly working from home at present but are available by email or via the switchboard.

Martyn Marples is acting diocesan secretary as well as head of finance.

Reverend Carollyn McDonald is currently acting Diocesan Director of Ordinands. The Assistant Directors of Ordinands are Mr Steve Hayler and The Revd Jacqueline Stober.

Revd Nicky Fenton has been appointed by the Church Commissioners to be Chaplain to the Bishop of Derby from March and Residentiary Canon of Derby Cathedral in the same diocese. Mrs Fenton hopes to take up her appointment in March.

Canon Linda Wainscot, formerly Director of Education for the Diocese of Coventry, is now Interim Diocesan Director of Education for two days a week and Dr Alison Brown will continue to support headteachers and schools, offering one and two days a week as required, ensuring their Christian Distinctiveness within the diocese.

Christine McMullen is temporarily overseeing readers in the diocese and locally Rachel Hobbs, warden of readers, is the person to contact. Rachel is also hosting the weekly Zoom meeting for readers for the time being.







#### **Statistics for Mission and Parish Returns**

Incumbents, wardens or treasurers in each parish will have access to the Parish Returns site within the C of E Portal and need to enter 'The October Count' and other end of year information on attendance, weddings, funerals . The deadline is 31<sup>st</sup> January 2021 and there is a downloadable guide available at <u>https://derby.anglican.org/en/our-mission/statistics-for-mission.html.</u>

The return has been simplified this year due to COVID and should be quite easy to complete as long as the service register book is available. There are also some questions about online worship this year. Any queries, please contact Angela, Deanery Administrator, who is overseeing the return for the deanery and is happy to discuss any queries with you and assist with the process for those who need help with the technology. She can also add new names to list of those able to access the site in your parish or issue new login and passwords if they have been forgotten!

# C of E Webinar – Celebrating Love and Life: Weddings and Christenings in 2021 and beyond

Weddings have happened, and weddings have been postponed. Christenings may simply have been put out of mind for now, yet family life goes on with its joys and its difficulties. #### Safeguarding Leadership Courses - now booking

The new Safeguarding Leadership module replaces C2, C3, and 'refresher' training, and is a requirement for all those who have any leadership responsibility in the church. All those with the Bishop's license (clergy, readers and lay ministers), churchwardens, and many others who hold positions of leadership in work with children, young people or adults who may be at risk or are vulnerable must complete this course. There is no bar to others completing this who don't 'qualify', as increased awareness at this level helps to communicate the importance of safeguarding within the church community. The module is a mixture of reading and preparation work, two 'Zoom' sessions, and some review and evaluation work. All churchwardens need to attend this level of training every three years. New churchwardens need to complete this training, along with the on-line C0 and C1 courses, as soon as possible, ideally within three months from appointment. Continuing churchwardens should do this course once they are approaching three years since they completed the former C2 course.

The team is currently unable to deliver this around the diocese face-to-face. Once people can meet in person to deliver training again there will be a limited number of Leadership sessions offered for those unable to access on-line sessions.

#### **Domestic Abuse Awareness (S3)**

This specialist session is principally for clergy, readers and those involved in pastoral care in churches, as well as PSOs, but all are welcome to attend. The session identifies Domestic Abuse and who is most affected by it, the implications and theological issues, and how churches and individuals can respond and support survivors. Safer Recruitment (S1)

This session is designed for clergy, anyone in parishes responsible for appointments and line-management, and PSOs. It explores legislation and statutory and other relevant guidance which ensures safer recruitment and helps churches become more familiar with House of Bishops' safer recruitment practice guidance. It covers safer recruitment processes and DBS checking, and how to identify and overcome any barriers to implementation.We are now able to offer a revised version which will be delivered through a 'Zoom' session. #### LiveLent 2021 church resources: God's Story, Our Story

It is based on the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent book for 2021, Living His Story by Hannah Steele, published on 19 November by SPCK.

Both the book and the accompanying daily reflections encourage all Christians to think about their calling, how to share their faith and reflect on the difference Christ makes in our lives.

We witness to God's story and the impact this has made to our story so that others might also find their story taking on new meaning in the light of God's love. While the current restrictions on daily life necessitated by the pandemic present significant challenges, the suffering and isolation many continue to face make the need for us to share God's love with our communities greater than ever. Rather than just being a Lenten discipline, this year's #LiveLent is a joyful invitation to make witness a normal part of the Christian life, the natural overflow of a life lived in devotion to Christ.

From Ash Wednesday (17 February) to Easter Sunday (4 April), there will six reflections for each week, written by Stephen Hance, the Church of England's National Lead for Evangelism and Witness. Each reflection will include a short passage from the Bible, a brief exploration of the reading, and a prayer. Additionally, each week will have a unifying theme and an action to be taken during the week.

The daily reflections will be made available through a booklet available to buy from Church House Publishing, as well as a free app, emails, audio and through the Church of England's social media accounts. Webinars will be offered early in 2021 to help churches plan how to make the best use of the range of resources and content for both individuals and groups
