The Church has an important role to play to bring Christian values into public discourse, but actions speak more loudly than words and there is a great deal that needs to be done to regain public trust.
- To fulfil its mission, the Church needs to be generous, welcoming, inclusive and open; a Church were everyone can participate fully in membership and leadership, regardless of ethnicity, class or background, sexual orientation, disability or gender. I will continue to work towards this goal.

My voting record:

- Voted consistently in support of simplification measures
- Voted for climate change targets to see the Church at net zero by 2030
- Voted not to take note of the Bishops' Report on Human Sexuality
- Voted in support of better Safeguarding practice, including engagement with survivors, independent oversight and redress
- Money is a problem that must be addressed. The hard reality is that the spending patterns of the past cannot continue into the future- we must cut our cloth accordingly. As difficult financial decisions are made, it's essential that spending is made where it's most needed, and our first priority as Christians must be to help 'the least of these' of Matthew 25.
- We must be good stewards of our resources finances, property and our planet. The decisions we make must take into account the long term impact on people, places and the environment.
- We need to continue to find and develop good church leaders, both lay and ordained, to lead the church, contribute and serve and most importantly to enable and encourage all church members, the whole body of Christ, to live out their faith in their everyday lives.
