


# Exploring Your Calling Responding to God's Call to Serve

### Meditation on Pilgrimage and Vocation

#### After you have completed the path, ask yourself these questions:


What experiences in your life have felt like twists and turns along an unknown path?





Someone passing on a message



#### Personal Reflection on Gifting Exercise

Now that you have got the findings from the exercise, spend some time thinking about the questions below.

Where did you score most highly?

Which gifts does this indicate?

Were you surprised by this?

How are you already using these gifts in your daily life?

How else could you be using them?

If you are not already using them, how could you utilise these gifts?

If you don't see an opportunity to use these gifts, what might God be saying to you?

What are you going to do about this?

How are you going to explore further?

Remembering means literally piecing together again what has been fragmented or broken. Ask God for the grace to remember the fragments of your life in a way that will reveal to you the patterns that are leading towards your wholeness in Christ.

Imagine your life as a river or path.

Remember the exterior events of your life and your reactions to them.

As you notice these events, notice the gifts that you

have received:

Skills and talents

Gifts of personality

Gifts from your circumstances - education, family,

friends, work, your whole situation in life

Gifts of people who have become significant to you.

Draw a timeline of your life

(you could use the image of the river or path).

Reflect on the times in your life when you might have

been aware of God's presence or call on your life.

It may be a time when you felt called or drawn to

something in particular, or it may be a time when you

were particularly aware of God's call of love.

It could be a calling to baptism, a calling in everyday

life or a calling within the church.


Mark your sense of calling on your timeline.

Feel free to be creative, using words, pictures and symbols.



Notice how God has been constantly present, not just in the special moments.

Notice especially how, with hindsight, periods when he felt absent may have prepared you in some way for further growth.



Notice how periods of difficulty strengthened you in certain ways, as hard exercise strengthens our muscles.

Remember how consolation and new strength have sometimes come when you were at the end of the line.

This isn't to pretend that everything, with hindsight, was good.

Become aware of how God touches your unique personality and brings you to life, how God speaks through your personality, gifts and decisions.

Can you see any concrete examples of how God is using your gifts or working through your decisions now, in your immediate experience?
