In hearing their words to us we are reminded of the Gospel message to live in God's love, most especially in the most diificult of times, as Evelyn Underhill reminds us we are always rooted in love as shown to us by Jesus. 'A link of love now binds you to it for evermore: in spite of derelictions, in spite of darkness, your will is harmonised with the Will that informs the Whole'. Cameron Butland

They accompany one another seeking to discern God's direction for their life. Often there is some confusion of the various names for this ministry but simply put it is where one Christian helps another in seeking to discern God in their life, is a partner in prayer, in short – a soul friend. Many Christians find being accompanied on their faith journey helpful. A spiritual director can help individuals explore their struggles and joys in

'Mysticism', a day of reflection on the writings of English Mystics

This Quiet Day will look at various English Mystics and reflect upon the Mystery of God. The day takes place on **Saturday 20**<sup>th</sup> **September at St Helen's, Darley Dale, 10am to 4pm.** The day itself will have three talks, time for personal reflection and two times of collective prayer. It will be a quiet day, silence will be maintained during the day, between the opening prayer and lunchtime. Then from the third talk until the discussion prior to the closing prayers. The day is open to anyone who wishes to attend.

#### **Retreat Bursaries**

The Association for Promoting Retreats provides a Bursary Fund to help and encourage more people to go on retreat, particularly if they cannot afford the full cost themselves. The APR relies on Member Retreat Houses to promote the availability of this assistance, hope that clergy and other ministers will highlight this support to those considering making a retreat, but who might be prevented from doing so for financial reasons. In September 2024, the scheme was extended to offer no-questions-asked bursaries for staff (teachers, headteachers, teaching assistants and pastoral/welfare staff) in Church of England schools to go on retreat at one of our APR member houses. ## Online Retreat - 'Living life to the full'

Jesus says, 'if you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by

this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love'. John 15:7-9

In John's Gospel Jesus tells us that he has come to bring us life, and life in all its fulness. Being a Christian should be a life of freedom held in the love of God. In this twenty-four hour retreat we will look at what it means, 'to live life in love to the full' through the writings of the teachers of the faith. We will also be reminded of the stories of the saints and faithful Christians who give us an example of living a full life.

Cameron Butland is leading a 24hour guided retreat online, following this theme. The retreat begins at 6pm on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> November and ends at 5pm on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> November. The format of this retreat will be five brief times of silent prayer with the talks and all the resources available from Monday 10<sup>th</sup> November.
