Below are a few selected Bible verses that might bring you some comfort at this time.

Deuteronomy 31:7-8

"Be strong and courageous....The LORD himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged." (NIV)

Joshua 1:9

Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go. (NIV)

The book of Psalms is a great place to go when you are anxious. This collection of poetry and prayers contains some of the most comforting words in Scripture. Psalm 23, in particular, is one of the most dearly loved, soul comforting passages in all the Bible.

Psalm 23: 1 - 4, 6

The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul. Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me ... Surely your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever. (NIV)

Psalm 27:1

The LORD is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The

Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. (NIV)

John 14:1

Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. (NIV)

John 14:27

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. (NIV)

Romans 15:13

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (NIV)

2 Corinthians 1:3-4

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. (NIV)

Jeremiah 1:8

"Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the LORD. (NIV)

Lamentations 3:25

The LORD is good to those whose hope is in him, to the one who seeks him; (NIV)

Micah 7:7

But as for me, I watch in hope for the LORD, I wait for God my Saviour; my God will hear me. (NIV)
