In the parish of St Stephen Sinfin. Clergy: Revd Nigel Elliott. Reader: Vince Shore, PCC & congregation.

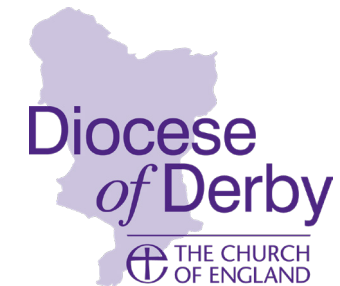
Saturday 11
